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ONE UNTYPICAL CHARACTER IN THE NOTES OF IVAN KROVONOSY IN THE
CODEX ASSEMANIANUS

(Summary)

The article explores the use and the phonetical value of the Cyrillic character Ѣ used by Ivan Kravonosy in his notes un the Codex Assemanianus. This character whose pattern is the sign for back nasal vowel ɔ (ɔ̃). This vowel can be a result of the development of both nasals and jers.

The forms крестѢ < кр'дстат < крѣстѣ; честѢнь < ч'дстан < ч'дст'дн чѣстѣнь are very significative for the later development of the ɔ < ѣ. крестѢ is probably the earliest article without final -т.
