In Europe and in North-America several projects are trying to handle the problem of the multitude of databases concerning medieval texts and manuscripts. Different aims and standards are proposed by networks of philologists, codicologists, librarians. The research about medieval cultures will depend more and more on such decisions. Presenting mainly the Slavonic and some aspects of Latin and Greek medieval written cultures, the workshop will provide a discussion about goals and practices of their interoperability for the next future.
